Student work included two reading quizzes, a research presentation on the Age of Reform, a reflection on the summer reading assignment (either *American Colonies* or *Most Blessed of the Patriarchs*), a comprehensive multiple-choice test covering 1491 – 1861, and a take-home final document-based final exam based on the causes of the Civil War.

Pittman, your work in Survey this term was strong. Your grades were all in the B+ to A range although the final exam earned a score of B- as the thesis was a bit muddled and the organization could use some editing. I'm so pleased to have you in class again this winter term because we can now work to sharpen and hone your writing.
